# **From the Rector**



One of my favorite questions I like to ask folks around this time of year is "What Christmas traditions do you have in your family?" While I honestly cannot recall specific traditions that lasted year after year in my own family, I will never forget those from my friend Andy's. I remember going over to his house to help decorate their tree, and out came their beer can, yes beer can, angel ornaments. Google "pop can angel ornaments," and you can get the idea. 16-year-old me tried to control the look of incredulity (and probably a little horror thrown in) no doubt flickering across my face as I asked his mom, "Do these go on the tree, too?" I will never forget her answer: "Of course, honey, if you aren't laughing at Christmas, is there even joy in the room?" While I definitely believe joy can be present without laughter, the point was well taken. The beer can angels were a reminder to not take ourselves, or our traditions, too seriously. A little laughter alongside the fancy silver crosses and pretty glass baubles could surely not hurt.

One of the traditions that is huge in my family is Epiphany. My mom spent several years living in Munich. In that part of Germany, children dress up as the three kings and move around neighborhoods singing carols, collecting alms (and sometimes candy), and offering doorway blessings. Mix that in with a good dose of Cajun culture, which involves delicious king cakes and parades, and one is destined for a joyous remembrance of the search—and eventual finding—of the infant king of kings. As a result, we will try 'take two' of our Epiphany celebrations this year. (We were snowed out last year.) Please join us at 6pm on Jan. 6<sup>th</sup> for a brief Epiphany prayer service complete with a rendition of *We Three Kings* and doorway chalking, followed by a chili cook off, Epiphany games, and plenty of King Cake. I realize this might be the second Shepherd's Staff in which it has been mentioned; can you imagine that might be because it's a tradition I have grown to love? Please do share your traditions and stories with me, especially if they involve something as delightfully random as beer can angel ornaments. I would love to know what has brought your family joy over the years. And I hope to see you on Epiphany.


